



now and again checked in a blind alley.


But always, if we have faith, God will open a door for us, not perhaps one that we ourselves would ever have thought of, but one that will ultimately prove good for us."



Swetha is now in the 9th grade. Being a bright student, she is able to clearly make out the difference between her previous school and IRS. She says that her previous school was concentrating only on studies and there was no scope for extra-curricular activities. But at IRS, the teaching is good, and there are also computer and science labs besides extra-curricular activities and games.

Although her father is not sure to what extent he can educate them, Swetha is very clear about what she wants to do. She wants to become a doctor and serve the poor and needy, she says and is confident that she can do just that.
